A value stream map is a simple diagram that shows the path of material and information flow in your process – start to finish. It **displays all the actions** (both value-adding and non-value-adding) that is required to complete a product or service.

Mapping your value stream allows you to take a high level view of all your processes, and see how work flows along it, and **see all the the many interactions** that take place. Once the value stream is completely mapped, you can see where processes are overburdened, or uneven, and where process waste exists so you can **identify targets for improvement**.

By taking a system level view of your processes, this keeps your team **focused on flow** and total effectiveness, and prevents them from sub-optimizing a process and chasing singular efficiencies.
